I have been on many mission trips


– to Belize, Costa Rica, Dominican

For anyone over the age of 13 can take the training. Two hours of training per session. \$25 that includes training, t-shirt, and certificate of completion upon passing the final test

Emerald

Most of us have seen a list of birthstones for each month. Do you know what your birthstone is? If you were born in the month of May, your birthstone would be an emerald. An emerald is a variety of the mineral beryl (often recognized as another, less precious, lighter green stone) which has been colored green by trace amounts of chromium (yes, think chrome or stainless steel).

The largest cut emerald found in the state of North Carolina, the so-called "Carolina Emperor" was originally 310 carats. It was cut to 64.8 carats and is now housed in the North Carolina Museum of Natural Sciences in Raleigh, with three larger, uncut emeralds.

In Bible times, the emerald was one of the rarest of gemstones, many of the finest being brought from Ethiopia or Egypt. Cleopatra had a famous collection of emeralds. There was an emerald on the breastplate of the high priest and one of the foundations of the New Jerusalem is made of emerald. And in Revelation 4:2-3, John says there was "a throne set in heaven, and One sat on the throne, and He Who sat there was like a jasper and a sardius stone in appearance, and there was a rainbow around the throne, in appearance like an emerald.
